Music Notes:

Choir Music: The anthem is taken from a great early work of George Frideric Handel (1685-1759), his creation of a passion oratorio using a libretto by the German poet, Barthold Heinrich Brockes (1680-1747). In this movement of the passion work, a hymn, sung by the choir, is laid, phrase by phrase, into a sumptuous instrumental piece (played today on the organ). Handel chose a well-known reformation hymn (see #514 in our hymnal) around which to compose the piece. The choir's text:

Lord, I trust thee, I adore thee. Ah! Thou friend of man, restore me! On thy loving grace relying, For the bread of life I'm sighing. Quench my thirst and let my hunger cease, Fill my heart with joy and endless peace.

When the breath of life has left me, May my soul be blended with thee.

Congregational Hymns: The text of "We Walk by Faith and Not by Sight" is one of a number of hymns by the English clergyman, scholar, and poet, Henry Alford (1810-1871). The tune ("Dunlap's Creek") was composed by the Englishman, Samuel McFarland (fl. 1816). "Live into Hope" is one of the many texts by the Presbyterian hymn writer, Jane Parker Huber (1926-2008). The tune ("Truro") is one of the many hymn texts by the distinguished pastor/writer, Brian Wren (b. 1936). The tune ("Truro") first appeared in an English collection published in 1789. The choir's descant is by William McCorkle. At the children's time we sing from "We Are One in the Spirit," which was created (words and music) in 1966 by Peter Scholtes (1938-2009), a Roman Catholic parish priest in Chicago. It quickly spread to worldwide use. The text and music of "Come, Live in the Light!," a rousing song of mission and call, were written in 1988 by the contemporary Catholic musician, David Haas (b. 1957), The refrain is based on the familiar challenge of Micah 6:8. The closing congregational response is the wonderful "Song of Hope" by Alvin L. Schutmaat (1921-1987), minister, musician, and longtime missionary in Latin America, who was known for using the arts to spread the gospel. The tune ("Argentina") is an Argentine melody of unknown origin, used by Schutmaat for his text.

Organ Music: The prelude and postlude are from organ transcriptions by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) of concertos for solo violin and orchestra by other compoers. The **prelude** is a movement from one of the violin concertos by the Venetian master musician, Antonio Vivaldi (1678-1741). The postlude is a movement from a violin concerto by Prince Johann Ernst of Saxe-Weimar (1696-1715), the son of a patron of Bach.
