Music Notes:

Choir Music: The anthem, by the English minister, composer, and musicologist, Erik Routley (1917-1982), is set to a text by the Englishman, Thomas Charles Hunter Clare (1910-????), derived from and inspired by today's scripture text, Acts 2:1-13. The choir's text:

On the day of Pentecost, when the twelve assembled,
came on them the Holy Ghost in fire which tongues resembled.
In the power of God he came, as the Lord had told them,
in his holy, blessed name with wisdom to uphold them.
In the Spirit then they stood to proclaim Christ dying,
and that he for all our good doth live, true strength supplying.
Still the night by which we live from our God descendeth;
still his spirit Christ doth give, who guideth and defendeth.
Praise, O praise our heavenly King for his grace toward us,
gladly now his glory sing, who doth such power afford us.

Congregational Hymns: Spirit, Spirit of Gentleness was created (words and music) in 1975 by the American songwriter and composer of hymns, James K. Manley (b. 1940), a minister in the United Church of Christ. The choir's descant is by William McCorkle. On Pentecost They Gathered, by the Presbyterian hymn writer, Jane Parker Hubert (1926-2008), was created to enrich the store of Spirit/Pentecost hymn language. The tune (Munich), a late 17th-century German melody, was adapted by Felix Mendelssohn (1809-1847) for his oratorio Elijah. The choir's descant is by Lois Fyfe. At the children's time, and again as the closing congregational response, we sing the vibrant refrain, The Spirit Is Moving in My Heart, by the Scottish pastor, writer, and musician, Kathy Galloway (b. 1952), a leader of the Iona Community worldwide. During the Distribution of the Lord's Supper we sing Veni Sancte Spiritus from the rich song liturgy of the Taizé Community in France. Over this simple but rich refrain are laid scriptural verses in many languages, celebrating the wonder of Pentecost and the Holy Spirit. Spirit, Open My Heart is a wonderful text (1994) by the respected hymn writer and worship scholar, Ruth Duck (b. 1947). The tune (Wild Mountain Thyme) is an Irish melody arranged (2011) by the American church musician, Alfred V. Fedak (b. 1953).

Organ Music: The prelude, by the German musician, Friedrich Wilhelm Zachau (1663-1712), of the town of Halle, where he taught the young Handel, is based on the melody of one of the great Reformation hymns to the Holy Spirit (sung to a text by Martin Luther: Come, Holy Spirit, Lord God). The postlude, by the brilliant and short-lived French organist, Nicolas de Grigny (1672-1703), is from a suite of pieces based on the plainchant melody Veni Creator Spiritus (Come, Holy Spirit, Creator). This piece is titled according to the organ stops used: Dialogue sur les Grands jeux, i.e., a dialogue displaying the potent reed stops of the instrument's different divisions.
